

HEADLINE: Perry Weitz of Weitz & Luxenberg to co-chair Dec. 1 conference airing jurist, attorney views of economy-clouded mesothelioma lawsuit prospects

SUMMARY: [Asbestos lawyers](#) will gather at a New York City conference Dec. 1 to learn what can be done to adjust their pre-trial, trial and settlement strategies in light of the U.S. economy's continuing troubles. Attendees will hear from Weitz & Luxenberg co-founder Perry Weitz, eight trial-court and appellate jurists, and others with insights regarding asbestos [mesothelioma litigation](#).

BODY: From Wall Street to Main Street, businesses are in a tailspin because of the poor economic environment – and, as a result, asbestos lawsuit awards and settlements in the months and years ahead might leave some plaintiffs disappointed unless their attorneys learn a few new litigation techniques, said Perry Weitz, Esq., co-founder of [Weitz & Luxenberg](#) PC, a mass tort and personal injury litigation law firm based in New York City.

Weitz will be among the featured speakers at a Dec. 1 New York City conference geared to helping asbestos lawyers adjust their pre-trial, trial and settlement strategies in light of the U.S. economy's continuing weakness.

Weitz and Evans are co-chairs of the conference, to be held at the Helmsley Park Lane Hotel in midtown Manhattan. The day-long gathering is produced by Perrin Conferences of Berwyn, Pa.

“We believe that attorneys who represent [mesothelioma victims](#) and their surviving family members will benefit from hearing what jurists on the bench and attorneys in the know have to say about litigating these cases in the current climate of business adversity,” Weitz said. “This conference is important because asbestos lawyers need to understand the new rules imposed by this economy. We feel the information to be gleaned at the conference will give attendees an edge.”

The conference begins at 8:45 a.m. and ends at 5:15 p.m. Cost to attend is \$795 per person.
